Integration	3 Dec	Presentation of the draft plan on operationalization of the polio-immunization integration for SC feedback and inputs, including:  Interim Programme of Work (iPOW) for integrated actions in the context of the pandemic  Management and coordination between POL and EPI  Suggestion to shift focus and come to a cost efficient, win-win framework between the two programmes  Community engagement and service delivery - strategic priority areas  Three areas of focus: high-risk communities, underserved communities, multiantigen SIAs  Proposed next steps  SC Discussion  Brainstorming stage at this point. The work will be widely consulted and further refined.  What will be different? What are the new resources that can ensure implementation?  Need to determine a way forward that works for polio and immunization.  This work is important. Need to think in practical ways and define what integration means for polio eradication.
